

OT STUDENTS—SENSORY SUITE / CRASH N WAKAKIRRI **TUMBLE ROOM**

Last term we welcomed two Occupational Therapy Masters students from the University of South Australia (Jordan and Kim) who are creating a Sensory Suite and a Crash n Tumble Room to allow opportunities for sensory regulation for all children. In the holidays, they were informed that they were successful in obtaining a \$10k grant from Variety the Children's Charity to help furnish the rooms. We are extremely fortunate to have the expertise and enthusiasm of Jordan and Kim as they work towards finalising these rooms for the students to use. There will be an official opening of the rooms for the school community to peruse on Thursday 9th August from 3.05pm-4pm, of which we warmly welcome any interested members of the school community to come along and have a look.

LITERACY COACH

This term we are releasing Amy Scheiner to work with a range of teachers in the areas of Literacy, with monies received from the Literacy and Numeracy First Funding to provide targeted support based on targeted student achievement in 2017. The funding targets students who did not make DECD benchmarks, are not maintaining sustained growth between year levels or are in the higher bands (academically succeeding) to ensure they remain on their successful learning path. Luckily for us, the majority of our identified students are in the higher bands, so Amy's focus will be ensuring that high standards are maintained in Years 2-5 by working alongside classroom teachers to ensure consistency and continuity in teaching and learning.

BOOKWEEK—WEEK 5

This year the 2018 Bookweek Theme is 'Find Your Treasure'; an exciting invitation with a world full of possibilities. One of the greatest joys of reading, for kids and adults alike, is the opportunity to escape into another world where you can find your treasure... something tangible or it may be simply the joy of reading! Delve in to decide where book week will take your family: will you find your treasure in the past, a fantasy land or perhaps even another universe?

Activities for the week include the BookFair from Tuesday 21st August (after school) until Friday 24th August, Bedtime Stories (where Junior Primary students come to the library and three members of staff read a story across three rotations whilst the students enjoy a warm milo in their Pyjamas. The week finishes with a Bookweek parade where students and staff alike dress up in their favourite character-which will be held on Friday 24th August.

This year is our inaugural year of participating in Wakakirri. Schools create a Story Dance to perform in professional theatres for audiences of family and friends. They are also attended by members of the National Panel in search of our Story of the Year. The Wakakirri program has been proven to develop creative thinking, self-confidence, teamwork, and life skills. Ultimately, our goal is to teach students about themselves and others via the creation and staring of stories. A Wakakirri Story Dance is a 3-7 minute student performance utilising a combination of dancing, creative movement and/or acting to pre-recorded music. Schools can tell any story with any combination of dance, creative movement, acting, prerecorded music, sets, and costumes. The possibilities are endless. Performing in Wakakirri is an experience students never forget. A unique sense of camaraderie develops among the students, as participants spend Show Day rehearsing and engaging with other schools. That night, they walk the red carpet with our panel representatives and perform live on stage. Each production is filmed for our weekly online publication, Waka TV, for broadcast in the Peoples Choice and Story of the Year Awards. Given that this is our first year of involvement, students from Rooms 5, 6 and 7 who wanted to be involved have been selected to participate in the event. The

PAT TESTING

Later this term, all students in years 1-7 will be involved in the PAT testing; Reading, Numeracy and Spelling. All schools are required to collect these assessments so that the DfE can ascertain how our students are tracking. We at school value this data as not only does it help guide our intervention and support, but it also provides teachers with direction for their teaching about areas that the students still require further support with, or alternatively, areas that our students (and staff) are excelling in.
