WELCOME TO TERM 4

Welcome to Term 4. We hope that you all had a happy, safe and relaxing holiday period with your children and that you are refreshed and rejuvenated for a fun packed and educational last term. Being the last term of the year, its going to be fast paced and action packed.

I would like to take this opportunity to inform our school community about some recent HR appointments.

- Mr Steve Lamb was the successful applicant of our recently advertised permanent position here at Banksia Park School R-7 for 2019.
- We welcome Mr Chris Johns to our ancillary team. Chris will be based in Room 13 for the remainder of the year.
- Mrs Carla Todd will be replacing Ms Deanna Belperio for the last 4 weeks of this term as Deanna is taking leave to prepare for her upcoming wedding.
- We welcome Mr William O'Donnell as our ICT technician. William replaces Mark Williams who won more hours at his other site.

We congratulate Steve, Chris and William on their appointment to Banksia Park School R-7.

Our school continues to grow. We welcome 12 new students to our school this term and will start 2019 at this stage with around 290 students and still rising. We will also be starting with nearly 40 Reception students. As we begin the early stages of determining class structures, we ask that you let us know ASAP whether your children are leaving Banksia Park School R-7 at the end of the year (excluding the Year 7 students who we are already aware are leaving) so that we can determine structures. We aim to be able to inform students of what class they will be in and who their teacher will be on Monday of week 9.

Attached to this newsletter is the Term 4 calendar of events which you may like to add to as the term progresses. Additional events / information will be sent out via the Skoolbag App and the School Blog.

CLASS FLYERS

This week you would have received a Term 4 overview from your children's class teacher and the specialist teachers. This will outline their rules, expectations and organisational matters so that as parents / caregivers you are aware and can assist your children in being organised.

Once again, we will continue using Skoolbag as our main tool of communication. We cant reiterate enough for families to make sure that

you down load Skoolbag onto your smartphone. If you do not have a smart phone, please notify the front office so that hard copies of information can be sent home to you, so that you are receiving all school communication.

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. If iPhone, you will see your school appear, click "Free" then "install".
- 4. If iPad, change the drop list to "iPhone Apps", your school will then be visible, click "Free" then "install".
 - 5. When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
 - 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device.
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
 - 4. Click the "Install" button.
- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
 - 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
 - 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

AUSLAN

Thanks to the families who completed the recent Auslan survey. 84% of families wish to see Auslan continue in 2019 and beyond, so we look forward to continuing Auslan next year.



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VANDALISM

We continue to experience a moderate level of vandalism, but of late it seems to have become a bit more apparent, especially in the South Yard. We find it extremely disheartening to see all of our hard work that we have created for our students, your children to use only to have it deliberately damaged by vandals. The new cubby house, garden and boat recently were hit by vandals in the school holidays. We ask all members of the wider community to keep on eye on the school after hours. If you see someone acting suspiciously or vandalising something, we ask that you call the police on 131444 immediately.

COMMUNICATION

Last term, there were a few communication issues between the school and the home—information going out late etc, which we again, apologise for. At staff meeting this week, discussed ways in which we improve our communications. On the back of this newsletter is a term 4 calendar of significant events, that as things arise we ask that you add dates to. All teachers will send home some form of communication each week: whether it be via a letter in a communication book, skoolbag, the blog, class dojo, a group email or even via the school facebook page. Alternatively, we ask that you as families keep a look out for the weekly communication from your children's class teacher(s).



CELEBRATION NIGHT

Last year we trialled bringing Celebration Night forward, this year we have put it back to Week 9. Given that our school is growing in size, we need to determine how this event can be best managed. Previously we have had all guests, staff and students in the Gym, last year, we grew beyond that and students waited in their classrooms before and after their performance. We have formed a staff committee how to best run the evening, but are also toying with the notion of an outside event on the oval, but this is heavily dictated by the weather. At this stage (given that we cant find another larger venue) our students will not be in the Gym again on the evening (unless of course we opt for the oval idea) but instead will be waiting in Blue Building with their teachers and will enter the Gym when their class is required on stage. This will allow sufficient seating for our guests on the night within the whole gym. Students will get to see a matinee version of the celebrations during the school day, in which any members of the school community would be able to attend if they are unable to make the evening event. Whilst we realise that this is not the most ideal situation, we believe that it is the best that we can arrange.
